Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation

COURSE OVERVIEW

- This unit describes the skills and knowledge require to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in line with Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines.
- This unit applies to all workers who may be require to provide CPR in a range of situations including community and workplace settings.
- The course is fully accredited nationally recognised training.



COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- There are no formal educational entry requirements, but participants must pass a Language, Literacy and Numeracy test prior to training.
 - You must be at least 14 years of age to attend the training.
- We ask that you wear clothing that is comfortable and not too restrictive to allow you to comfortably perform CPR and other practical activities.
- You must wear enclosed footwear at all times while training with us.

DURATION & STRUCTURE

- The course is conducted face to face in a classroom based learning environment over 5 hours, 3 hours face to face and 2 hours pre-course activity. You can attend the training at designated training venue.
- You will conduct a range of simulated activities, work in small groups and you will need to complete a theory component online prior to attending the practical day to be deemed competent. Proof of completion of the theory electronically is required before we can confirm attendance at one of our practical sessions.

POTENTIAL CAREERS

- This program has a very broad application in all sectors of the community and all workplaces and industry. It does not directly lead to a defined employment outcome in its own right, but is a component of a set of skills that can lead to employment or assist with maintaining conditions of employment.
- For example, all teachers and childcare workers and educators need to maintain currency, as do many other workplace First Aid and WHS positions

- Recognise an emergency situation
- Identify, assess and minimise immediate hazards to health and safety of self and others
- Assess the casualty and recognise the need for CPR
- Seek assistance from emergency response services
- Perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation in accordance with ARC guidelines
- Display respectful behaviour towards casualty
- Operate automated external defibrillator (AED) according to manufacturer s instructions
- Accurately convey incident details to emergency response services
- Report details of incident to workplace supervisor as appropriate
- Maintain confidentiality of records and information in line with statutory and/or organisational policies
